Habitat has put summer to bed and has much to celebrate. Since the end of our fiscal year, your support has contributed to incredible work. We ended the year with 22 homes under construction, five families who PAID off their mortgage, doubled our volunteerism efforts, launched the Women Build committee, and held a successful Hope Builders Luncheon.

As the crisp autumn air settles in, winter will be here before we know it. We're reminded the momentum must continue—and Habitat for Humanity-Spokane is grateful for your ongoing commitment. This new fiscal year will challenge Habitat to serve more families and build more community.

We have a robust goal of completing 25 homes this year through new construction and rehab acquisition. With the average homeownership program timeline at 1.5-2 years, we'll need your continued support as 57 families are currently in the program.

Please keep us in your hearts and minds as we enter this season of giving. Your support goes further than sticks and bricks; it transforms lives and builds communities of opportunity. The cost to build has become increasingly expensive. When we couple that with high interest rates and inflation, it's no surprise that over 1,500 families are waiting just to apply to the homeownership program.

It's hard to believe that Habitat could build a home for under \$150,000 just five years ago. Today that has more than doubled. Even with these challenges, innovation — and probably a teaspoon of stubbornness — Habitat remains committed to meeting the housing demand of our community.

Join us in that commitment by attending our events and advocating for Habitat's mission. Don't let the colder weather deter your volunteerism activities — 8 homes

are dried in and ready for interior work. Let's keep the momentum going so Habitat for Humanity can continue to be a beacon of hope for our beautiful Spokane community.

Future Homeowner Highlight

Meet Adhanom, one of Habitat's partners currently earning their hours in our Homeownership Program. He has a 24 year old daughter and a 22 year old son in the Navy. As a certified nursing assistant, Adhanom takes care of two disability clients in their homes during the week, and picks up shifts at a facility to earn extra income - but that still is not enough to afford a home in Spokane. He moved to America 41 years ago

with his parents to escape the war in Africa and loves living in the PNW. "I love Spokane because it's a great place to hike, to run or jog, to go tubing, beautiful Riverfront Park, there are different seasons." After being here for 10 years, Adhanom is ready to put down roots and is looking forward to the stability an affordable home can offer. "I never had a house for my family. I believe a home is where the family comes together [and] is a good start to make a better life." - Adhanom

Deer Park

We are working to have eight homes in our Hope Meadows development, Phase V, completely finished on the outside for ideal indoor volunteer opportunities this winter. All eight homes will have interiors finished by spring of 2024!

Spokane

Habitat-Spokane is working on five rehab homes in the city. This winter will be utilized to repair the current homes and volunteer opportunities will be available to help us finish them! We are also partnering with multiple skill centers and apprenticeship programs to assist with our developments.

Born and raised in Spokane, she currently lives at an income based apartment complex but wants her kids to be able to come home to comfort and a yard. Melissa is incredibly proud that her son was the first child in the 5th generation of her family to graduate from local Rogers High School in Spring 2022! When asked what her favorite part is about the program, she said she is most excited about the Habitat College and volunteering at community events and the Habitat Store. Access to Housing in the U.S. ls NOT an equal playing field___

Black Americans and other people of color face greater housing unaffordability and insecurity.

Historical race and class discrimination have produced deep-rooted gaps in generational wealth and continuing pattern of segregated neighborhoods, as well as continued lack of access to credit opportunities for affordable housing.

These in turn are primary contributions to lack of equity in housing and neighborhood choices today.









These well-documented and historic patterns still affect the makeup and opportunities of our communities:

A A Redlining

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- Racially restrictive housing covenants
- Demolition of Black neighborhoods as part of urban renewal or highway construction
- Exclusionary zoning
- Racially targeted predatory lending

A striking legacy of this history is the continuing, stark homeownership gap.

Equity in Housing is achievable

Habitat-Spokane was chosen by Habitat for Humanity International (HFHI) as one of the ten recipients nationwide to receive a Catalyst Grant for the Advancing Black Homeownership (ABH) Initiative, which

increases access to affordable homeownership options in our low-income and BIPOC communities. The Core of HFHI and Habitat-Spokane's work is equitable housing for all people, particularly BIPOC individuals and families. Habitat-Spokane's ABH network of policies and practices will promote homeownership opportunities for historically disadvantaged people.

ISSUE

Credit is difficult, if not impossible, to access for many lower-income households and households of color.

SOLUTION

Increase and broaden access to safe and sound credit for under-served populations and communities.

- Expand funding for down payment assistance
- Promote fair lending
- Update credit scoring systems

ISSUE

A shortage in affordable homes across the U.S. affects homeowners and renters especially Black and Hispanic households

and those with the lowest incomes.

SOLUTION

Support programs and policies that produce and preserve affordable housing and create new tools for housing stability.

- Local and state housing trust funds
- Vouchers for rent and homeownership
- Emergency rental assistance programs
- Mortgage forbearance and foreclosure prevention programs

ISSUE

The legacy of government-endorsed policies that enabled and entrenched racial segregation still persist today.

SOLUTION

Create land use policies and inclusionary zoning practices that promote the development of affordable housing.

- End racial and economically exclusionary
- Grant equal access to housing for households of all income levels

ISSUE

There are very few affordable homes available in environmentally healthy areas with access to economic and social opportunities and infrastructure like public transportation.

SOLUTION

Broaden economic mobility and access to communities with opportunities.

- Strengthen fair housing laws
- End racial and economic segregation
- Give underrepresented communities a meaningful voice in planning decisions
