ANIMAL EVACUATION

Household Pets • Pets are welcome at the Convention Center shelter. • Bring food, medications, carriers, leashes, and vaccination records if available. • SCRAPS is coordinating displaced animal assistance. • SpokAnimal may assist small pets as capacity allows. • Report lost and found animals through SCRAPS and local networks.	Horses & Livestock • Spokane County Fairgrounds is sheltering large animals. • HEART Spokane is assisting with evacuations and emergency animal sheltering. <i>Call ahead before transporting livestock.</i>
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SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

- **Gonzaga Students & Employees**

Temporary campus housing may be available for displaced students, employees, and household members for up to two nights.

Contact Gonzaga before arriving.

- **Spokane Tribal Members**

The Spokane Tribe is assisting tribal members affected by the fires.

Contact the Tribe directly for current assistance.

- **RVs & Trailers**

The Spokane County Fair & Expo Center has opened RV parking for evacuees traveling with trailers or recreational vehicles.

Confirm availability before arriving.

FOOD, HEALTH & ESSENTIAL NEEDS

Food & Cash Benefit Replacement

Washington DSHS can assist individuals receiving food or cash assistance who lost food or benefits because of the fires.

Ask about:

- Replacement food benefits
- Emergency assistance
- Community Services Office locations

Medical Needs

Notify Red Cross shelter staff if you need:

- Replacement medications
- Medical equipment
- Oxygen
- Mobility assistance
- Disability accommodations
- Pharmacy assistance

Veterans should contact Mann-Grandstaff VA Medical Center or their VA care team.

IF YOUR HOME WAS DAMAGED

Insurance & Recovery

- Contact your insurance company as soon as possible.
- Photograph damage before cleanup.
- Save receipts for emergency expenses.
- Keep a written inventory of damaged belongings.
- Do not return until officials declare the area safe.

HEALTH & AIR QUALITY

Protect yourself from wildfire smoke:

- Stay indoors with windows and doors closed.
- Run an air purifier or clean HVAC filter.
- Set vehicle air systems to recirculate.
- Avoid strenuous outdoor activity.
- Wear a well-fitting N95 or KN95 mask outdoors.
- Check on children, older adults, pregnant individuals, and people with asthma, COPD, or heart conditions.

TRUSTED INFORMATION

Follow official updates from:

- Spokane County Sheriff's Office
- City of Spokane
- Spokane Fire Department
- Spokane Regional Emergency Communications
- Northeast Washington Fire Information
- Washington State Department of Natural Resources
- Local fire districts

Do not rely solely on screenshots or reshared evacuation maps. Always verify the original source and timestamp.

WAYS TO HELP

Verified Relief Funds

Consider donating through established organizations such as:

- Spokane County wildfire recovery efforts
- Innovia Foundation Eastern Washington Wildfire Fund
- United Way of the Pacific Northwest Disaster Recovery Fund
- American Red Cross Disaster Relief

Be cautious of newly created personal fundraising accounts or unverified payment requests.
